

Apple Mac Keys

Lomak and Notesai are fully compatible with Macintosh computers when set to an Apple Mac layout.

Key assignments for Mac computers

Lomak key	Apple Macintosh key	Location
Win App	Left Command (Apple)	Control bar
Alt keys	Option keys	ditto
Start	Right Command (Apple)	ditto
Ins	Help	Left circle
S/Lk	Num Lock/Clear	ditto
SysR	Keypad "=" key	ditto
Brk	§ and ± (when Shifted)	ditto

Additional function keys (use F/Shift-Confirm first)

Lomak key	Apple Macintosh key	Location
Period	F13	Right circle
Right Arrow	F14	ditto
Down Arrow	F15	ditto

Audio and CD keys

Lomak key	Apple Macintosh key	Location
Sound Set-Up	Vol- (decrement)	Control bar
Brightness Set-Up	Vol+ (increment)	ditto
Sensitivity Set-Up	Mute (on/off)	ditto
Layout Set-Up	Eject (open/close)	ditto

The above keys operate immediately without a Confirm. The Vol-/Vol+ keys will repeat if a pointer is held over the respective key.

Waking a Mac from Sleep mode

Your Mac may be set to enter Sleep mode after a certain period of keyboard/mouse inactivity. However, the Lomak remains operational and you can rouse the Mac with any keyboard or mouse operation. Be patient—the response may take a second or two.

Creating international keys

The Macintosh (set for the standard US keyboard) uses the **Option (Alt)** key to create international characters, as shown in the tables that follow. For shifted combinations, you may prefer to click **Option (Alt)** before clicking **Shift**, as the order does not matter. For characters requiring accent marks, it uses the “dead key” method in which an **Option** key combination is Confirmed first (producing no output) and then the character to be modified is Confirmed second, to generate the desired international character.

Currency symbols

Symbol	Option (Alt) combination	Comments
€	Shift-Option-2	Euro sign
£	Option-3	Pound sterling
¢	Option-4	Cent sign
¥	Option-Y	Japanese Yen
f	Option-F	Dutch Florin (may not be in older fonts)

Accent keys

Accent	Option (Alt) combination	Examples
Acute	Option-E	á, etc.
Circumflex	Option-I	â, etc.
Grave	Option-` (Backtick)	à, etc.
Tilde	Option-N	ã, ñ, õ only
Umlaut	Option-U	ä, etc.

The above keys are “dead keys”, in that they do not produce any output when Confirmed but instead affect the next character Confirmed (if this is a vowel or other permitted character).
