Dead keys

Dead keys are keys that do not create characters immediately, but modify the next key (if allowed) by adding an accent mark to it. The French and Belgian French layouts have six dead keys on the Control bar on Options 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 which are used as described in the section *The dead keys on the Control bar* in the page *Creating international keys* in the User Guides. This is an easy method of creating accented characters.

Accent	Option key	Standard French dead key sequence
cedilla (ç)	0†	
tilde (ã)	1	Shift-Back tick (~) in the left circle
umlaut (ä)	2	
acute (é)	3††	
circumflex (â)	4	Shift-6-Confirm (^) in the right circle
grave (à)	5	Back tick (`) in the left circle

† Option 0 will always produce ç regardless of the character that follows its selection.

†† Option 3 in the French layout will always produce é regardless of the character that follows its selection. In the Belgian French layout, it can be applied to several characters.

AltGr key

The **Right Alt** (or **AltGr**) key can be used to create the following character:
