Dead keys

The US International keyboard has five “dead keys”, i.e. keys that generally, depending on context, produce no output on the first activation but may modify the next keypress. You will not normally need to use these keys, because their action is emulated by Lomak’s international keys selected with Shift-Confirm. However, if you do click such a key and are puzzled why there is no corresponding character produced in your document, the reason lies in the key being a dead key. Note that a dead key followed by a **Space** will create the dead key character by itself, whereas a dead key repeated a second time will create two dead key characters in succession.

Accented characters are also created with Option keys 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 on the Control bar which are used as described in the section *The dead keys on the Control bar* in the page *Creating international keys* in the User Guides. This is an easy method of creating accented characters.

Accent	Option key (from v4.3)	Standard US International dead key sequence (all firmware revisions)
tilde (ã)	1	Shift-Back tick (~) in the left circle
umlaut (ä)	2	Double quote (“), i.e., a shifted single quote
acute (á)	3	Single quote (') in the left circle (modifies c to ç)
circumflex (â)	4	Shift-6 (^) in the right circle
grave (à)	5	Back tick (`) in the left circle

Lomak keyboards fitted with UK overlays have different characters printed in the positions of the single quote and back tick keys of the US overlay.
